



CalOMS Tx Version 3.2 Release Bulletin (April 26, 2007)

A. New CalOMS Tx Report

A1. New Substance Abuse and Crime Prevention Act (SACPA) Report

A new SACPA Program Management Report has been added to the suite of standardized CalOMS Tx reports available to counties. The new report provides information about AOD treatment clients who are part of the SACPA or Drug Court populations and is broken down into detailed client characteristics and admission and discharge counts for each quarter of the fiscal year and as cumulative to date.

To access this new standardized CalOMS Tx report, ITWS users who have already completed the enrollment process will need to complete the “Request Additional Membership” process on the ITWS portal. New ITWS users enrolling for the first time will be able to select this report as part of their initial enrollment process.

NOTE: Similar to the other reports available in CalOMS Tx, the SACPA Program Management Report data are based on service counts and not the counts of unique clients. This may result in multiple counts for the same client if they had more than one AOD treatment admission or discharge during the reporting period.

B. Changes to CalOMS Tx Reports

B1. Data Quality Compliance Report: The Data Quality and Compliance Report has been modified to take into account county providers that have been closed when calculating the Total Provider Count. The report now excludes closed county providers from the Total Provider Count displayed on the report. Prior to this enhancement, the report included a county’s closed providers in the Total Provider Count, which resulted in the incorrect determination of compliance for measure CM-1: Number of Providers Not Reporting.

The Data Quality and Compliance Report has also been modified to present a strictly geographic view of the compliance data. This means that the report record counts include all records submitted by a particular county for all services provided by county contract providers within the geographic boundaries of the particular county, regardless who paid for the services provided. Prior to this enhancement the record counts for a particular county included services that a particular county paid for, regardless of who submitted the data or where the service was performed (e.g., services provided outside the county for which the county paid for).

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B2. Service Utilization—Length of Stay Report: The Service Utilization, Length of Stay report has been modified to include a row to each table on the report listing median length of stay.

B3. Placement of Comparison Group Data in Outcome Reports: The placement of comparison group data on outcome reports has been modified. The reports will only display the selected comparison group data one time at the front of the report immediately following the report cover page.

Previously, the selected comparison group data was presented integrated throughout each report in data tables immediately following each primary group data table. With this enhancement, if an outcome report is run for a number of individual providers, the comparison group data retrieval and calculations processes will only happen once vs. multiple times as was originally designed. This will also result in shorter reports (fewer overall pages for multiple provider report runs) because the comparison group data will be presented only once at the front of the report vs. on every provider's individual reports.

B4. Like-Sized County Comparison Groups Option: New values have been added to the Comparison Group C/DCP Filter to provide an additional level of data comparison for counties. Using this new like-sized county comparison option, counties will have an additional comparison group option—either “MBA counties,” “Small Counties,” “Medium Counties,” and “Large Counties”—depending on which category the county belongs to.

NOTE: Each county will only see the new comparison group filter option that corresponds to their “size” category. This additional Comparison Group filter selection is only available to the counties; direct contract providers will continue to be able to see only their own data.

B5. Special Population Filter Item: ‘Medi-Cal Eligible’: A new value—“Medi-Cal Eligible”—has been added to the Special Population filter on the Outcome Reports Filter screen.

B6. Special Population Filter Item: ‘Men’: A new value—“Men”—has been added to the Special Population filter on the Outcome Reports Filter screen. A “Women” Special Population filter currently exists.

B7. New Period Report Type Filter: A new filter—“Period Report Type”— was added to the Outcome Reports Filter screen. Using this filter selection determines whether the outcome reports select data based on a client's Admission or Discharge or Annual Update dates. The addition of this filter enables users to more flexibly report on data for clients served during a report period rather than being limited to clients admitted during a specified report period. Prior to this enhancement, the data reported in all Outcome Reports were based on the client's Admission date.

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B8. Age Filter: A new report filter was added to the Outcome Reports Filter screen to enable the user to select data filtered by a variable range of client ages at admission on the Outcomes Reports. With this enhancement, users will be able to specify a minimum and maximum age range for the client population to be selected for the report. This enhancement was requested by counties during the statewide training sessions last summer to address the need to report specific age-range data that is different from the standardized age ranges included in the existing standardized reports.

B9. Race Filter: A new report filter—“Race”—was added to the Outcome Reports Filter screen to enable the user to filter by race on the Outcome Reports.

B10. Ethnicity Filter: A new report filter—“Ethnicity”—was added to the Outcome Reports Filter screen to enable the user to filter by ethnicity on the Outcome Reports.
