



**Perinatal Programs:
Alcohol & Drug Treatment**

The Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs' (ADP) Office of Perinatal Substance Abuse (OPSA) oversees a statewide network of approximately 288 publicly funded perinatal alcohol and other drug treatment programs. OPSA was established in 1990 by Assembly Bill 3010 (Speier) to develop a coordinated state strategy to address the substance abuse treatment needs of pregnant and parenting women.

In fiscal year 2002-03 ADP allocated \$23.5 million from the State General Fund for perinatal substance abuse programs. ADP allocated an additional \$17.1 million in federal Substance Abuse, Prevention and Treatment Block Grant Funds to California's perinatal programs. An additional \$4.4 million in SGF and Federal funds were used to provide perinatal services to Drug Medical beneficiaries.

The following California Alcohol and Drug Data System data was submitted to ADP as required for all publicly funded providers as well as all licensed Narcotic Treatment Providers.
