The RC operates a toll-free, **non-crisis, non-emergency** statewide telephone number available for California residents needing ATOD prevention, treatment and referral information.

### **CLEARINGHOUSE**

More than 600 ATOD booklets, pamphlets, research papers, posters, technical manuals, and other printed materials are available to California residents at no cost. The Clearinghouse provides this information to community and school organizations, families and individuals, prevention and treatment programs, and government agencies. ### **STATEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITY**

**Please read the following information regarding borrower's responsibility for Resource Center (RC) Library material.**

A Library Loan Agreement must be completed, signed by applicant, and submitted with a copy of the applicant's business card with name and title, or agency/organization's letterhead stating applicant's position with signature for approval. An application must be on file in the Resource Center Library prior to processing any loan requests.

The **Library Loan Agreement** is a signed statement whereby the applicant agrees to:

- abide by library rules and policy;
- return materials **ON** or **BEFORE** the due date;
- pay all recovery cost(s) of lost or damaged materials;
- indicate if materials are damaged or not in usable condition; and
- if sending by mail, adequately package materials being returned and ship via UPS or U.S. Mail with insurance.

**Note:** Copyright laws protect materials provided by the RC Library. Unauthorized reproduction constitutes a violation of U.S. copyright laws.

### **Lending and Patron Policy**

Library materials are loaned directly to employees of government agencies and employees of organizations licensed and certified by the Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs and/or funded through a county alcohol and drug program. Members of the general public may borrow materials by requesting an Interlibrary Loan through their local library.

### **Loan Periods**

Materials are loaned for a three-week period and may be renewed upon request and approval. At the discretion of the Resource Center Library, longer loan periods may be arranged for special circumstances.

**Loan Limits:** Materials are limited to two DVDs, videos or curricula per loan period. Print materials are limited to 20 per loan period.

Materials that are exclusive to Library use may only be used in the Resource Center Library and may not be loaned.

All journals and periodicals are considered Library use only to non-ADP employees.

### **Abuse of Library Privileges**

Abuse of Library privileges may result in loss of library privileges. Examples of abuse of library privileges include repeatedly not returning materials on time, not responding to overdue notices, mutilation or damage of library materials, not responding to invoices for replacement cost(s) for lost or damaged materials, misuse of library materials, computers, and electronic resources.

**Borrower's county administrator, supervisor, or employer will be notified regarding retention of library materials and/or non-payment of replacement invoices.**

### **Overdue Materials and Replacement Fees**

#### **Overdue Notices:**

The Resource Center Library sends out overdue notices, by mail, on the first day of each month. It is the borrower's responsibility to keep the library informed of their current mailing address. The library assumes no responsibility for misdirected notices. Not receiving an overdue notice does not negate the borrower's responsibility to return items to the library on time.

#### **Library Fines:**

The Library does not charge daily overdue fines on circulating materials.

#### **Replacement Invoicing for Damaged and Lost Materials**

Library materials not returned, or returned with damage, will be invoiced for replacement cost(s) assessed at a minimum standard replacement fee or at current list price.

#### **Payment of Library Invoice:**

Payments for the damaged/lost materials should be made payable to the Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs.

Instructions for payment are printed on the replacement invoice. Do not send payments to the Resource Center Library.

## NEWLY ADDED DVD/VIDEO TITLES TO THE RESOURCE CENTER LIBRARY

### **Addiction: Why Can't They Just Stop? (page 28)**

A HBO documentary aimed at helping Americans understand addiction as a treatable brain disease. This documentary addresses different aspects of the disease in order to shed light on the most current, promising developments in the field. (DVD – 1 hr. 30 min.)

### **Beat Addiction: Choose the Right Path (page 34)**

Addresses the spectrum of addictive and compulsive behaviors. Designed to teach middle- and junior high-school students the risk factors of addiction and the information necessary to make healthier choices. (VHS - 15 min.)

### **Bringing Young People to the Policy Table (page 35)**

Provides ten core recommendations on how young people's mental health can be improved by making simple changes in the way systems work, and in the way therapists, case managers, probation officers and others are trained to do their jobs. (DVD – 12 min.)

### **Drugs: True Stories (page 50)**

A personal story of how the abuse of alcohol and marijuana led to an addiction of prescription drugs. This video will help young people and parents understand the dangers associated with the misuse of drugs. (DVD – 30 min.)

### **Joy of Being Normal (page 66)**

A short video presentation illustrating the ability of methadone treatment to produce responsible and productive citizens. (VHS – 7 min.)

### **Marijuana: Neurochemistry & Physiology (page 71)**

Presents the latest research and findings on the neurochemistry and physiology of marijuana. (DVD – 32 min.)

### **Medical Aspects of Chemical Dependency: The Neurobiology of Addiction (page 72)**

Presents the latest research findings on brain chemistry. Includes newer drugs such as OxyContin and GHB. (DVD/VHS – 22 min.)

### **Men in Recovery (page 72)**

Features a men's group candidly discussing topics that may hold men back from progressing in recovery. (VHS – 28 min.)

### **Meth: Our Nation's Crisis – Toolkit for Change (page 74)**

This toolkit contains everything you need to start a comprehensive community campaign against meth. The DVD presents three meth-awareness videos for teens and adults. (DVD/CD-ROM – 1 hr. 17 min.)

### **Methamphetamine: Neurochemistry & Recovery (page 75)**

Presents the latest research and findings on the neurochemistry and recovery of methamphetamine. (DVD – 31 min.)

### **Methamphetamine: New Knowledge, New Treatments (page 75)**

Provides information to debunk the myth of methamphetamine addicts as being hopeless and untreatable. (DVD – 1 hr. 4 min.)

**Methamphetamine 101: Etiology and Physiology of an Epidemic (page 75)**

Designed to provide an overview of the medical, psychological, and societal effects of methamphetamine abuse and dependence, and is intended to be used in conjunction with the second module addressing methamphetamine treatment. (DVD – 1 hr. 40 min.)

**Methamphetamine 102: Etiology and Physiology of an Epidemic (page 75)**

Provides information about evidence-based treatment and addresses foundations for a clinical approach to methamphetamine treatment with emphasis on the Matrix Model, an evidence-based treatment protocol that has withstood the rigors of clinical trial research. (DVD – 2hrs.)

**Smashed: Toxic Tales of Teens and Alcohol (page 92)**

Presents the consequences of underage drinking and impaired driving. Focusing on the effects of impaired driving collisions when the victims do not die, it shows young crash victims from their arrival at the trauma facility and follows their progress over time. Features interviews with medical personnel, teens, friends and family members. (DVD – 1 hr. 15 min.)

**Sobering Facts: The Risk of Alcohol Use (page 93)**

Equips teens with important information about alcohol use--how it affects the brain, how it increases the likelihood of accidents and injury, and how it can harm school performance, relationships, and health. (VHS – 11 min.)

**There's No Place Like Home: Growing Up with Family Violence (page 99)**

A four-part video documentary covering stories of how family violence affected their lives. Part-one is about a mother and daughter who flee an abusive situation at home. Part-two covers child abuse, substance abuse and suicide. Part-three is about suicide, sexual abuse and criminal behavior. Part-four covers domestic violence and emotional control of a mother and her two children. (DVD – 50 min.)

**Treating Co-Occurring Disorders (page 100)**

Explores the correlation between substance use disorders and severe mental illness. (DVD – 1 hr 15 min.)

**Vida en al Comunidad para Todos! Life in the Community for Everyone (page 103)**

This bilingual video gives service providers and educators who serve Hispanic/Latino parents and families the information and educational tools to address the substance abuse prevention and mental health issues that affect them. (VHS – 1 hr. 10 min.)

**Weighing the Risks (page 104)**

Teens may face a lot of pressure to try drugs and alcohol. Listen to several teens who have learned, sometimes the hard way, to say no. (DVD/VHS – 30 min.)

**Women in Recovery (page 107)**

Women talk about how they keep their recovery strong--and what they are learning about trust, faith action, and friendship along the way. (VHS – 22 min.)
