SUBJECT: Revision to Fiscal Year 2000-01 Substance Abuse Treatment Trust Funds Allocation

This letter is to inform you that the allocation amounts for Fiscal Year 2000-01 Substance Abuse Treatment Trust Funds have been revised. In the original allocation, the funds were distributed to 57 counties rather than 58 counties, based on an existing joint powers agreement with Sutter and Yuba counties. The Department is required to apply the allocation methodology formula equally to all counties. The allocation has been revised to reflect the 58 counties separately and results in a reduction of less than one percent per county. The enclosed table reflects the revised amounts. The Act also provides a total of \$60 million in the current fiscal year for start-up costs and \$120 million annually for drug treatment services in Fiscal Years 2001-2002 through 2005-2006. The California Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs has been designated as the agency to implement and administer the Act.
