SUBJECT: Fiscal Year 2001-02 Substance Abuse Treatment
Trust Funds: Preliminary County Allocation

This letter transmits the preliminary allocation of Fiscal Year (FY) 2001-02 Substance Abuse Treatment Trust Funds to counties for planning purposes. The attached preliminary allocation is subject to final approval in the State Budget for FY 2001-02.

Allocation Methodology

The Department used the following allocation methodology for planning purposes.

- One-half of the available funds to counties is distributed based on the standard alcohol and drug program fund methodology of \$2,500 per \$1 million, with the remainder distributed based on population.
- One-quarter of the available funds is distributed based on treatment caseload data.
- One-quarter of the funds is distributed based on adult felony and misdemeanor drug arrest data.

The data used for the methodology is the same data as used in the allocation of the FY 2000-01 start-up funds. This allocation reflects the amount of funds available to counties after withholding five percent for the Department's administrative costs and other unmet needs as well as an additional \$600,000 for the statewide evaluation.

Specific information concerning the use of these funds and how to access the funds is contained in Chapter 2.5, Title 9, Division 4, of the California Code of Regulations. The adopted regulations pertaining to these funds were sent to County Lead Agencies under separate cover. Please refer to ACLA Letter #01-02. Instructions for county plan submission have been mailed to you under separate cover. Please refer to ACLA Letter #01-03.
