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- The parole agent will be the primary point of contact for the assessment center and treatment provider.

It is important to note that the procedures described above apply to parolees arrested on or after October 1, 2002. For the pre-October 1, 2002 arrests, assessment centers will continue to receive referrals from BPT under the procedures in effect at that time. These parolees will present the forms previously in use, *the Special Conditions of Parole and Release of Information*.

In addition to the Activity Report and Proposition 36 waiver form, a directory of all parole units by region (Attachment C) is provided for your use. Please share this information promptly with your assessment center staff, and any other entities impacted by these changes.
