SUBJECT: SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND CRIME PREVENTION ACT OF 2000
(SACPA) – RELEASE OF COUNTY PLAN GUIDE

REFERENCE: Sections 9515, 9520, and 9525, Chapter 2.5, Division 4, Title 9, California Code of Regulations (CCR); and Divisions 10.8 and 10.9, Health and Safety Code

This letter transmits the updated county plan guide for completing the FY 2005-06 county plan under the Substance Abuse and Crime Prevention Act of 2000 (SACPA).

Preliminary allocations of funds to counties for FY 2005-06 are not expected to be available until late February 2005. However, the FY 2005-06 county plan guide is being released now to allow counties additional time to develop their county plans. Deadline for plan submission is May 1, 2005.

Allocations for FY 2005-06 will be based on the allocation formula contained in the emergency regulations effective July 1, 2004. The Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs (ADP) must approve the plan before funds may be distributed.

County lead agencies must show they have collaborated with stakeholders in developing their FY 2005-06 county plans. ADP considers ongoing collaboration vital to successful operation of SACPA. Sections 9515 and 9520, Chapter 2.5, Division 4, Title 9, CCR, contain the requirements for collaboration.
