



NPI Only Implementation Fact Sheet

- ☑ Effective **February 1, 2008**, ADP will no longer accept DMC claims submitted with the four-character DMC number identifying the provider. All DMC claims must use the NPI as the single provider identifier.
- ☑ Claims submitted on or after **February 1, 2008** which do not have the NPI as the single provider identifier or claims that include the four-character DMC number will be rejected.
- ☑ Effective **February 1, 2008**, all submitted claims will be adjudicated as either approved or denied; erroneous claims will no longer be suspended on Error Correction Reports (ECR) for correction and return for processing.
 - All claims on suspense as of **February 1, 2008** will be denied.
 - All denied claims are eligible to be resubmitted within 6 months from the claim's denied date; the current resubmission guidelines will remain in effect.
 - Effective **February 1, 2008**, the Edit and Duplicate Error Correction Reports, and the Aged Suspended Claims Reports will be discontinued.
 - Approved and denied claim information will be available in the 835, e-EOB and paper approved and denied reports currently distributed.
- ☑ NPI confirmation documents from the National Plan & Provider Enumeration System (NPPES) for every billing DMC parent and satellite provider must be sent to Karen Woolley at 1700 K Street, Sacramento, CA 95811 or through fax at (916) 322-1176.
 - Trading partners will not be able to submit 837P claims with the NPI as the single identifier in test or production for any provider for which ADP has not received this confirmation.
- ☑ The NPI will be returned in the 835; no other changes will be made to the 835 at this time.
- ☑ An ADP Bulletin with an updated 837P/835 Companion Guide and testing guidelines will be distributed by the end of October, and will be available on ADP's website.
